Powering Green Energy Together

Dear members of Galway County PPN, Earlier this year, Bord na Móna and SSE Renewables, two leading low-carbon energy providers, announced their formation of a joint venture to develop a series of onshore wind energy projects. This partnership will deliver up to 800MW of new renewable energy generation for Ireland. As part of this joint venture, Bord na Móna and SSE Renewables are proposing to develop a wind farm on Derryfadda, Boughill and Gowla Bogs located in County Galway, along the border with County Roscommon. The proposed wind farm will be known as Derryfadda Wind Farm and will contribute towards goals set out in Ireland's Climate Action Plan 2024. The proposed development of Derryfadda Wind Farm will contribute to both Ireland's and the European Union's renewable energy targets. It will also contribute to increasing the security of Ireland's energy supply and will facilitate a higher level of energy generation and self-sufficiency.

As the project is at a very early stage, the proposed number, location and height of turbines have not yet been determined. It is very important to us that local communities have the opportunity to provide feedback to help inform the design, construction and operation of the proposed wind farm.

The joint venture partnership is fully committed to informing and engaging with you through an active communication programme.  ♦ Flood management measures (e.g., Swales, attenuation ponds)






